At our last meeting . . .

Lori Woosley talked to us about the Ramona branch of the Boys & Girls Clubs of Greater San Diego, where she is the branch director.

Lori said about 90 youngsters attend daily programs at the clubhouse, taking part in a variety of activities, both inside and outside. The program is offered from 2-6 p.m. Monday-Friday during the school year and longer hours during the summer.

There is a games room, art room, computer lab, teen room, plus a big-screen TV, the Power Hour program (homework), a performing arts program, sports and more. The annual membership fee is \$60 a child, but there are scholarship programs available to those who cannot afford the full fee.

Day camps are offered during the summer, and during school holidays—at an extra fee.

The club sponsors several community events: a spring carnival and egg hunt, the Childrens Festival and a fall festival (held in the evening and featuring a haunted house).

Plans for a gym at the clubhouse site have been put on hold because of the poor economy, but Lori is hopeful that a proposal for an indoor/outdoor soccer arena will go forward. The proposal also includes extending the parking lot and upgrading landscaping. She also is hopeful that a plan to turn the tennis courts into lighted basketball courts will get the nod.
