At our last meeting...

Our special guest was Rotary District Gov. Dave Breeding, who talked about how he got involved with Rotary. It began when he saw a “Goodbye Polio—Thanks Rotary” bumper sticker in 1998. At that time, Dave, whose mother was a polio victim, had recently traveled to India, where he was overwhelmed by the number of beggars, all polio victims. “I knew about polio, but I had never been face-to-face with the horror of it before.” When he asked about the bumper sticker, he learned what Rotary was doing to eliminate this horrid disease in the world, and he became a Rotarian. Dave, who has participated in Immunization Days in third-world countries, said, “This organization is doing something very important for the world.”

He handed out the bumper stickers that drew him to Rotary, and explained that this year, the Rotary theme is Building Communities—Bridging Continents. He encouraged us to support the Rotary Foundation’s Annual Programs Fund that enables Rotary to do its good works. Rotary asks each Rotarian to sustain this via a minimum \$100 donation each year. Donations go into the bank for the first three years, with income off of that being taken for RI administration expenses. Then the full donation is taken out of the bank and used for Rotary projects (See Floyd Fiduk for more information).

Dave also invited each of us to attend a new District 5340 event: a combined District Conference, Foundation Seminar and Paul Harris Gala, to be held Oct. 21-24 at the Pala Mesa Resort in Fallbrook. Attendees can stay at the resort, or, early registrants can take advantage of Rotary host homes.

The conference schedule includes Thursday: golf; Friday, lunch, Rotary sessions, western barbecue dinner; Saturday: morning Foundation Seminar, open afternoon, Foundation dinner with keynote speaker Dr. Peter Salk. Saturday afternoon is set aside for leisure activities such as wine-tasting, hiking, visiting the Art Center, etc. The Friday night barbecue will be at The Lazy Creek Ranch, which has many western props used in movies and has a full-scale operating railroad.
